INTRODUCTORY LOCAL LAW NO. 2 OF THE YEAR 2021 A LOCAL LAW AMENDING THE VILLAGE OF HOOSICK FALLS ZONING MAP

Section 1. Title

This local law shall be referred to as "A Local Law Amending the Village of Hoosick Falls Zoning Map".

Section 2. Purpose and Intent

The intent of the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Hoosick Falls in enacting this Local Law is to amend the Zoning Map of the Village of Hoosick Falls to place Tax Map Parcel No. 27.19-17-7, a parcel totaling 0.17 acres and located at 17 Carey Avenue, into the CI Zoning District.

Section 3. Zoning Map Update

The Zoning Map of the Village of Hoosick Falls is hereby amended as follows:

a. The zoning district classification for Tax Map Parcel No. 27.19-17-7 is hereby amended and placed in the CI Zoning District.

Section 4. Severability

If any clause, phrase, sentence, paragraph, section, or part of this Local Law is adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this Local Law, but shall instead be confined in its operation to the clause, phrase, sentence, paragraph, section, or part directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

Section 5. Effective Date

This Local Law shall take effect upon its filing with the Secretary of State.
